

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Managing the Emergency

City Manager/City Attorney Role

- Declaring an Emergency
 - City Attorney prepares documents to declare emergency
 - Works to prepare documents, declarations, meeting notices, convene Council when needed.
 - City Council affirms declaration

Emergency Ordinances

- Example: Curfew (Northridge)
- Example: Prohibiting price gouging (Northridge)
- City Attorney Role
 - Advises on reasonableness
 - Does the circumstance justify an emergency ordinance?
 - Affect citywide or smaller geographic region?
 - Should timeframes be established?

Managing the Emergency

Fire Chief Callahan Sudden Passing

- Collapsed running to second based during softball game (City team)
- Passed away from heart attack

Used Disaster Structure in Local Emergency

- Activated the Emergency Operations Center
- Authorization for City expenditures, made public purpose findings.
- City Attorney Role
 - Does the circumstance justify an emergency resolution?
 - Review policy to ensure proper use of City funds

Large Scale Event (memorial)

Outside agencies came to pay respects





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Balance with Day to Day Operations

Example: Keep services open? Or Repurpose?

- Santa Monica libraries (Northridge Earthquake)
 - No structural damage, only non-structural damage
 - Libraries could have continued typical operations
 - Layout of the space/functionality evaluated
 - Repurposed into call centers during the emergency

Other Considerations

- Is Staff needed for other services?
- Is regular service safe to provide?
- Is regular service too much of a distraction?

City Attorney Role

- Trusted advisor to City Manager
- Communicates through the CM/EOC Director
 - Attend EOC briefings
 - Advise CM and emergency response team on areas to consider/areas of concern








Working with Elected Officials/Other Agencies

2003 Malibu Fire (Pacific Fire)



Quick Facts:

- Cause: Powerlines
- Acres Burned: 797
- 3 homes damaged, 100 threatened, 350 saved
- 56 Fire Agencies, 1,036 Firefighters, 5 Helicopters, 1 fixed wing plane





Working with Elected Officials/Other Agencies

Role of Elected Officials:

- Spokesperson for Community
- Provide confidence to Community
- Provide elected officials with accurate information (keep them up to date)
- Provide defined role for effective communication
- <u>Example:</u> Malibu Mayor's question results in near relocation of emergency shelter

Coordination with the school district:

- Work with school Superintendent
- Are you planning to close schools?







Working with the Media

Bomb Threat on City Bus



Quick Facts:

- Man declares there may be a bomb on City bus(s)
- All buses stopped/evacuated
- Cleared 500-foot radius around buses
- Buses checked by police/bomb dogs





Working with the Media

Communication and Roles

- Learned of the threat from Cal Poly Police via student video
- Suspect informed reporter who then informed the police
- Work together, use media to broadcast accurate information
- Also, gather accurate information from the media

City Manager/City Attorney Role

- How does this impact City Facilities?
 - Evacuated City Hall due to Bus Stop proximity
- Communication to the public
 - Press release, social media, Nixle
- Attorney involved in big picture briefings, not necessarily operational specifics
 - Ask questions when staff may be overlooking something





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Sometimes You Just Get Lucky

Champagne Tower

- Near collapse during Northridge Earthquake, severe structural damage
- Structural bracing after the earthquake held the building together
 - Shaking for 15 more seconds would have collapsed the building







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Sometimes You Just Get Lucky

St. Fratty's Day/St. Patty's Day

- City was prepared for event to happen Saturday night (prepared to deploy officers)
- Event happened 4:30am Saturday morning
- Lucky that no one was severely injured
- Lucky there wasn't civil unrest/riot



Quick Facts:

- Week before St. Patty's DayLarge scale student planned event
- Thousands of attendees, numerous persons congregating on roofs
- Garage roof collapse
- 7 inured (hospitalized), minor injuries





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Lessons Learned

Make the call sooner rather than later

- Declare the local emergency or disaster, or don't.
- Request state and federal declarations also

Start Documenting Costs

- Document costs right away for cost recovery
- Document with pictures and geo-locations as soon as possible
- (Northridge) Street cleanup without documentation of locations, time, or costs.

City Attorney

- Keep hard copies of important documents
- Think ahead, what is the exit plan for the temporary situation? (e.g. Tent Cities)

Remember:

- City Manager and City Attorney make a great team
- City Attorney can help communicate with/manage Council members
