SAN GABRIEL VALLEY CITY MANAGERS' ASSOCIATION
BY-LAWS

## ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the San Gabriel Valley City Managers' Association.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSES
The purposes of this Association shall be:

1. To provide an informal affiliation of the City Managers within the San Gabriel Valley.
2. To be a regional subdivision, Area Group, of the City Managers' Department of the League of California Cities.
3. To promote the purposes and goals established in the League of Califania Cities Constitution and By-Laws.
4. To serve as a technical and advisory liaison to the City Managers' Department to the rage.
5. To seek the personal development and enrichment of its members through the promotion and conduit of meetings, seminars, social events, and discussions.
6. To provide a support system for all manters, and particularly for City Managers in transition.

## AFIICTE III - MBYBERSIIP

Membership shall be limited to one of the following designations: Member, Associate Member, and Honorary Member.

Sec. 1. - Member - A Member shall be any individual who is the administrative head of a member city of the League of Callfomia Cities within the geographical boundaries of this Area Group, as designated by the City Managers' Department. It is recognized that reference to the San Gabriel Valley is made for identificatimon purposes only and that sane cities within this designated Area Group may not, in fact, be within the San Gabriel Valley.





The cities currently designated as being within this Area group are:

Cities designated in this Area Group may be altered from time to time by the City Managers' Deparment without need to fommally adopt an amendment to these By-Laws.

Menbers shall have voting rights and are eligible to becane Association officers.

Sec. 2. - Associate Manber - An Associate Menber shall be any retired City Manager, City Manager in transition, full-time assistant to an acministrative head of a menber city, or any other middle managerient level enployee so designated by the administrative head of said city. Associate Menters may participate furly in the activities of this Association, except they may not vote or hold office.

Sec. 3. - Honarary Menber - An Honorary Member is a classification which may be bestowed upon any formar member who has rendared exceptianal serrice to this Assoctation. Such designation shall ba made by a majority vote of the menbers present and voting at any regular meeting of the Association. An Honorary Menber may not vote or hold office.

## APIICTE IV - FETBS AND DUDS

Sec. 1. - Fees - Any fees assessable against Association Menters at any Association activity, such as meetings and seminars, may be set by the President so as to offset the added expense of spscial events, including, but. not limited to, speakers, programs, ercibits, or accuucdations that will directly benefit and camplement the purpose of the Association.

Sec. 2. - Dues - Dres may be levied or adjusted against all menbers of the Association upan appoval of the majority vote of the menbers present and voting at any regular meeting of the Asscciation.

Opon adoption of these By-Laws, the annual dues shall be establiahed at $\$ 25$ per fiscal year per city. The annual dues shall be due and payable by all menbers of the Association on July 1 of each fiscal year.

The exclusive purpose of dues is to provide the necessary financial support to Association business activities as such may be determined by the President or the general membership.

## ARTICLE V - OFFICERS, DUTIES, VACANCIES

Sec. 1 - Officers - The Officers of this Association shall be a President, Viee-President, and the Association's Representative to the Executive Committee of the Department.

Sec. 2 - Term of Office - The term of offlice of the President and Vice-President shall be one year. Said officers shall be elected by the Association Members at the regular June meeting each year.

The Association's Representative to the Executive Committee of the City Managers! Department shall serve for a term of two years, which shall commence in June of oddnumbered years and terminate two years thereafter in June of an odd-numbered year.

Sec. 3 - Duties and Responsibilities - The President shall preside at all meetings of this Association. He shall appoint any committees and have general supervision of the work of this Association. A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled for the unexpired term by the succession of the Vlee-President.

The. Viee-President shall serve as Secretary, Treasurer, and Program Chairman of thee Association, and shall perform other related duties as assigned by the President. The VicePresident shall preside as Association meetings in the absence of the President. A vacancy in the office of Vice-President shall be tilled by an election at the naxt ragutar meeting following the occurrence of that vacancy.

The Association's Representative to the Execurlive Committee of the City Managers' Department shall serve on the Executive Committee of the Department and shall represent this Association at chose meetings.

In the event of a vacancy, the President of the Assoclation shall be the Representative, or shall appoint a mermber of the. Asoclation to fill the vaeancy. and that.person filling such vacancy shall hold office until the completion of the regular term of office.

## ARTICLE VI-OFFICER SELECTION

In selecting officers the following criteria should be considereds

1. To search out and select those persons who have a notable professional reputation and have exhibited an active interest in Association affalrs, and who are willing and able to serve.
2. To weigh factors such as city size, general law vs. charter city, all geographical areas, full-service vs. contract cities, and those persons who have malntained an active interest and are knowledgeable about the history and purpose of this Association.

It is the declared intent of this provision that outstanding candidates are to be selected to serve as Association officers without restriction as to the characteristics or geographical location of a candidate's city.

## $\therefore \quad$ ARTICLE VII - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

All Members and Associate Members may submit nominations for Association officers for consideration by the Nomination Committee. Sajd nominations must be submitted at least one week prior to the last regular June meeting of each fiscal year. The Nomination Committee may submit their awn nominatlons as well. Those members whose names will be submitted to the Assoeiation's membership for consideration will have consented to serve if elected, unless they personally state otherwise.

The election of officers shall be held at the last regular meeting in June of each fiscal year. All newly-elected officers shall take of fice lmmediately following their election, except in the case of the Association's Representative to the Executive Committee, who shall take office immediately upon the adjournment of the Annual Conference in odd-numbered years.

## ARTICLE VIII - VOTING

Except in cases where otherwise provided, all voting in this Association shall be viva voce ${ }_{r}$ unless a roll call vote is demanded by representatives of three or more cities, in whlch case thëe Member of a registered city present and in good atanding shall cast one vote. $\mathbb{A}$ majority of the votes cast by those Members in attendarce shall be necessary for a decision.

## ARTICLE IX - ASSOCIA TION MEETINGS

This Association shall meet on the third Wednesday of each month at a place and time as designated by the President. As he or she might deen necessary, the President may postpone or cancel any particular monthly meeting.

Special Association meetings may be called by the President or upon written request by five Members stating the purpose for such a meeting.

Notice shall be given to all members of the time and place of all regular and special meetings by mail, or at least five (5) days prior to said meeting.

At his discretion, the President may designate any given month to be "dark" and no meeting shall be held.

## ARTICLE X-ASSOCIATION COMMITTEES

Sec. 1. - Ad Hoc Committees - Upon direction of the Association membership, or at the sole discretion of the President, Ad Hoc Committees may be established to pursue a special study, cause an lnvestigation of an isolated nature, or prepare a report on any given subject.

Membership selection and their number shall be determined by the President.
The term of office of all Ad Hoc Committees shall automatically terminate at the close each fiscal year, or upon the transmission and acceptance of the committee's report, whichever event is last to oceur.

Sec. 2 - Nomination Committee - The Nomination Committee shall consist of the current President and the two immediate past Presidents who are still Members of this Associarion.

The Nomination Committee will meet at least once annually prior to the last regular meeting of the fiscal year so as. to compose a list of proposed nominees for the following Association officers:

President
Vice-President
Representative to the Executive Committee (two-year term)

## ARTICLE XI-RULE OF ORDER

Subject to the provisions in the League By-Laws and the Department of By-Laws, Robert's Rules of Order shall prevall at all Association meetings.

## ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended as necessary by a majority vote of those members present and voting at any regular meeting of the Association.

## ARTICLE XII - CONFLICT OF BY-LAWS

If any portion of these By-Laws are declared to be contradictory or in any way conflict with the Constitution and By-Laws of the League of Callfornia Cities, then that portion shall become inapplicable and the Constitution and By-laws of the League or the City Managers' Department of the League shall prevail.

## AFIICTE XIV - PROHIBITION ACAMNS SALES ACITVIIIDSS

No member having an association with camercial proiucts or serviens used by local goverruent may conduct any sales activities during meetings or events of the Association.
