




#### **Homeless Capital of the Nation**


### 150,000 individuals chronically or sporadically homeless


#### **Short Term vs. Long Term Solutions**

#### **Home for Good: Demonstrating Results**

Since 2011, Home for Good partners have housed **27,478** homeless people, including:

15,436 Veterans	12,042 Chronically Homeless
2,701still need housing	15,121still need housing


**\$650 million** over the last four years to address homelessness in Los Angeles County.





#### Coordinated Entry System – July 2014

- Know everyone on our streets and in shelters
- Harness all possible housing and services resources
- Link each person to the right housing for their needs
- Lower admin costs, increase efficiency and speed

#### What is Permanent Supportive Housing?


- It's just housing!
  - Renovation or conversion of existing buildings
  - Construction of new apartment buildings
- With operating budgets that also ensure residents receive supportive services

Gold standard in addressing chronic homelessness: Supportive housing with case management





#### Why Permanent Supportive Housing?



- Probation
- Sheriff mental health jail
- Sheriff medical jail
- Sheriff general jail
- LAHSA homeless services
- GR Housing Vouchers
- General Relief
- Food Stamps
- Paramedics
- Substance abuse services
- Mental Health

## "Housing for Health Program" L.A. County Dept. of Health Services

- Permanent supportive housing model
- Partners with nonprofit agency, Brilliant Corners
  - Leases units in larger building throughout L.A. County
- Assigned mental and physical health provider for each tenant
- Assigned case worker and emergency call number

Goal: House 10,000 individuals within 5 years to save up to \$320 million per year.





#### Housing Impact on L.A. County Health Budget

- \$70 million <u>per year</u> inpatient costs for homeless patients
- \$32,000 year-over-year savings following housing a DHS client
- Reduction in hospital utilization by homeless before and after housing:
  - o 77% reduction in emergency room visits
  - 77% reduction in inpatient admissions
  - 85% reduction in inpatient days







#### **Accelerating Permanent Supportive Housing**

- Increase number of PSH units in City of Los Angeles three-fold
- Shorten the entitlement process
  - Cutting timeline by two years reduces average cost per project by \$330k
- Work with cities throughout the county to implement PSH





#### **Resources to End Homelessness**

Los Angeles County "Boomerang" Fund	State Legislative Proposals
\$30M in 2016	No Place Like Home: \$2B for PSH statewide
Increase to \$100M/year in four years	Additional \$200M to provide rental subsidies over short-term
	Assembly proposed \$1.3B for affordable housing





#### Partnering with CCF

- Can Provide Grants to Community Organizations
  - Research to make the case: polling, cost analysis
    - Build local community leadership to facilitate support, create public will, and combat NIMBYs
- Linkages to experts and technical assistance to create PSH

72% of voters support permanent supportive housing

Only 35% believe police-based solutions are most effective

 Loans and start up grants to fast track the construction process, but cannot cover subsidy costs for construction
