Below are highlights of the major housing bills that Cal Cities has won for its member cities in the past few years.

100+ Housing and land use bills protecting and enhancing local control

MAJOR HOUSING LEGISLATION CAL CITIES **DEFEATED** THAT WOULD HAVE ERODED LOCAL LAND USE AUTHORITY

SB 50 (2020)	Would have eroded local control and provided/given new rights to developers	Defeated	WIN 🛇
